Flight Changes & Flexibility

How to change an American Airlines flight for free?

You can change your American Airlines flight for free in three key scenarios:

- 1. **24-Hour Grace Period:** Cancel or change any ticket (except Basic Economy tickets booked less than 2 days before departure) for a **full refund or change within 24 hours of purchase**, provided the booking was made at least two days before departure.
- 2. **Standard Change Fee Waiver:** American Airlines has eliminated change fees for **Main Cabin tickets and higher** for domestic and most international travel. While the **change fee** is waived, you will still be required to pay the **difference in ticket price** (**fare difference**) if your new flight costs more.
- 3. **Same-Day Standby:** All customers can stand by for an earlier flight on their day of departure at the airport for **free**, though seating is not guaranteed.

Can you change a nonrefundable airline ticket on American Airlines?

Yes, you can change a nonrefundable ticket (Main Cabin or higher) without paying a change fee, but you must pay the difference in the fare. If the new flight is less expensive, you will receive a travel credit (eCredit) for the difference. Basic Economy tickets are generally non-changeable and non-refundable after the 24-hour grace period, though exceptions apply for travel originating in Europe.

International Baggage Rules

What is the American Airlines baggage allowance for international flights?

The standard baggage allowance (number of free bags) on American Airlines international flights varies significantly by destination and cabin class.

- Most Transatlantic & Transpacific Routes (Main Cabin): Often include one free checked bag (up to 50 lbs / 23 kgs).
- Premium Cabins (Business/First): Typically include two or three free checked bags (up to 70 lbs / 32 kgs each).

• Carry-on: All customers are entitled to one free carry-on bag (Max: \$22 \times 14 \times 9\times and one personal item (Max: \$18 \times 14 \times 8\times inches).

What are the American Airlines international baggage fees?

Fees for international checked bags vary widely based on the region. A few common examples for the **first checked bag** (50 lbs / 23 kgs) in Basic Economy/Economy are:

Route Example	First Checked Bag Fee
U.S. to Europe	Often \$75 (Basic Economy) or Free (Main Cabin)
U.S. to Canada/Mexico/Caribbean	\$35
U.S. to Australia/New Zealand	Often Free (Main Cabin) or \$75 (Basic Economy)

International Check-In Deadlines

What is the American Airlines check-in time for an international flight?

American Airlines requires you to be checked in and have your boarding pass by a minimum of 60 minutes before scheduled international departure.

For flights to select destinations (such as Amsterdam, Athens, Dublin, and Tel Aviv), the check-in deadline is **75 minutes** before departure.

When is the American Airlines international flight check-in deadline?

Check-in Requirement	Deadline Before Scheduled Departure
Minimum Check-In (All International)	60 Minutes
Minimum Check-In (Select Airports, e.g., TLV, AMS)	75 Minutes
Recommended Airport Arrival (with bags)	3 Hours
Boarding Gate Deadline	30 Minutes

Crucial Note: You must be checked in, have your baggage tagged, and be at the boarding gate **before the final deadline**, or you risk losing your seat, even if you checked in online.
